

GPN-GL15 Using Guidelines for

Hotels and Inns

Green Purchasing Network (GPN)

1. Scope

These guidelines cover important environmental issues that shall be considered when selecting and using accommodations such as hotels and inns.

2. Guidelines

When selecting and using accommodations such as hotels and inns, the matters listed in the Ecochallenge Checklist for "Hotels and Inns" shall be considered in selecting and using accommodations that are advanced in environmental conservation.

Eco-challenge Checklist for "Hotels and Inns"

<Contents>

The checklist consists of the following five categories.

- I. Attitudes toward environmental conservation
- II. Food- and drink-related environmental consideration
- III. Resource efficiency and recycling
- IV. Efforts to combat climate change
- V. Green purchasing, chemical substances, etc.

<Basic Items>

Of the items of the Eco-challenge Checklist for "Hotels and Inns" the items which are basic and easily implemented as the first steps shall be selected.

<Allotment>

In principle, one point shall be allotted to each item and half point or two points shall be allotted to the items that come under the following cases.

Half point allotment:

 Cases where the efforts have already been carried out by the majority of accommodation facilities, but are still needed to be remained as important ideas

Two points allotment:

- Cases where the item shall contribute to environmental conservation and be expected for great improvement by the efforts
- Cases where the efforts shall greatly influence the organization and other efforts
- Cases where the efforts with originality and active capital investment shall be considered as



advanced

*These guidelines are subject to change in accordance with new findings and changes in social conditions.

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The conditions for hotels and inns to be run in the Eco-challenge Database for "Hotels and Inns"

The conditions for hotels and inns to be run in the database shall be to meet the requirements of at least 11 of the following 15 "basic items".

(1) Efforts at the level of the entire business

	concrete goals and plans to reduce of chemical usage and

- II. Food- and drink-related environmental consideration
- Should a hotel or an inn have a restaurant as a tenant, the restaurant shall be considered for the answer.
- Should a hotel or an inn offers no meals to guests, the text "a hotel or an inn offers no meals" shall be filled in the following open-ended section.

(1) Reducing and recycling of food waste

III. Resource efficiency and recycling

(1) Room service

	shower heads, and sensors for its toilets, showers, and faucets.

IV. Efforts to combat climate change

(1) Heat source and heat transport

53	A hotel or an inn shall introduce devices to use waste heat of boilers,	2
	micro gas turbines, cogeneration systems, fuel batteries, etc. to improve	
	energy efficiency.	
54	A hotel or an inn shall introduce pumps and fans with good efficiency	2
	and pipe insulation to improve heat transport of steam or refrigerant	
	inside its facilities.	
55	A hotel or an inn shall use renewable energy such as solar water	2
	heating systems, photovoltaic generation, wind generation, and	
	geothermal power.	

(2) Air conditioning

56	A hotel or an inn shall endeavour to improve the insulation of its	2	
	buildings by adopting double-entry doors, revolving doors, double-		
	glazed windows, and insulating sashes as well as by greening rooftops		
	and walls.		
57	A hotel or an inn shall set its voluntary standards for the setting of the	1	
	temperature in its offices and backyards.

58	Air conditioning of each guestroom shall be able to be controlled	2	
	independently.		
59	A hotel or an inn shall introduce sheer curtains, window shades, fusuma	1	
	and shoji doors for its guest rooms.

(3) Lighting equipment

61	A hotel or an inn shall replace incandescent light bulbs inside facilities	
	with compact self-ballasted fluorescent lamps or LED lamps and install	
	HF inverters or LED luminaires as fluorescent luminaires.	
	More than 20% of light bulbs and fluorescent luminaires shall be	
	replaced with compact self-ballasted fluorescent lamps/LED lamps and	1
	HF inverters/LED luminaires.	
	More than 80% of light bulbs and fluorescent luminaires shall be	
	replaced with compact self-ballasted fluorescent lamps/LED lamps and	2
	HF inverters/LED luminaires.	



62	A hotel or an inn shall manage its electricity usage in guestrooms when	
	no guests in the room.

91	A hotel or an inn shall recharge groundwater from rainwater by planting	1
	trees in its premises and permeable surfacing of outside parking lots.	
92	More than 20% of premises shall be planted with trees or permeably	1
	surfaced.	
93	A hotel or an inn shall implement environmental activities such as	2
	cleaning and conservation of its neighbouring areas or actively	
	participate in activities organized by local municipality or organizations	
	(and employees shall be encouraged to join such activities).
